The year ends on a mixed note for the Republican Party. While the United States House went Democratic, the Senate had a gain of two seats. Next year's Senate will be 47 Democrats and 53 Republicans plus the vote of Vice-President Pence in the case of a tie. This gain of two seats will give Republicans much more clout in passing bills even with a few defections from the GOP.

Tennessee is looking very red as they maintain two Republican Senators, a Republican Governor (first back-to-back Republican Governors since Reconstruction), plus walk-out State House and Senate. Democrats picked up only Beth Harwell's Belle Meade House Seat.

Congratulations to Clarksville's own State Senator, District 22, Mark Green who is now our Congressman in District 7. Mark will officially resign on January 2at which time the Montgomery County Commissioners may appoint an interim State Senator until a special election is held, probably in May. Montgomery

County Commissioners do this temporary selection because Mark Green is a resident of Montgomery County, but also represents Stewart and Houston Counties. It appears there will be numerous candidates for the permanent election for State Senate. District 22.

Our former District 7 Congressman, Marsha Blackburn, now answers to Senator Blackburn. When Democrat Phil Bredesen ran for Governor in 2006, he swept all 95 counties, but in 2019 Representative Blackburn won all except three counties. Democrats, Including Gubernatorial Candidate Karl Dean, won Memphis (Shelby Co), Nashville (Davidson Co.), and City of Chattanooga. According to Steve Gill, political editor of the *Tennes*see Star. "The rural counties of the South that used to vote Democratic are now dark red counties, favoring Republicans. The gun-toting, God-fearing, prolife & too high-tax-fearing Democrats of the past in rural areas now vote for what THEY believe rather than what their granddaddy used to vote as a Democrat, & that's what has changed the political landscape." Gill said both Senator-elect Marsha Blackburn and Governor-elect Bill Lee had vote margins similar to those of Donald Trump in 2016 and reflect the growing rural advantage for the GOP in the South.

## ELECTION 2018

It was a pretty exciting and historic November 2018 election for Montgomery County and for Tennessee, as well as the Nation.

In Montgomery County, there was a 47.78% overall turnout. This is wonderful compared to past elections! In the Partisan races, of the 51,745 votes, *Bill Lee* was elected as Governor with 53.96%; of the 51,931 votes, *Marsha Blackburn* for US Senate, 49.94%; of the 48,514 votes, *Mark Green* for US House of Rep District 7, 58.80%; of the 16,272 votes, TN House of Rep District 67 went to the Democrat with 52.43%; of the 26,629 votes, TN House of Rep District 68, *Curtis Johnson*, 66.85%; of the 8,292 votes, TN House of Rep District 74, *Jay Reedy*, 56.69%; of the 16, 129 votes, Metro Gov Charter Ref—County, Against 87.87% and of the 32, 130 votes, Metro Gov Charter Ref — City, Against 58.80%. On November 20, 2018 the **Tennessee House Republican Caucus** held its meeting to hold the caucus elections. All 73 members of the caucus were there, including the **20 new members**.

There is a new Governor and his new administration, 20 new Republican members and eight new Democrat members in the House, three new members in the State Senate (two Democrats,

one Republican) and when Mark Green's and Mark Norris' seats are filled that will add two more — all new leadership in both parties.

Tennessee made history electing **Marsha Black**-

burn as the first woman to the U.S. Senate from Tennessee.
