

DID YOU NOW?

Through Wednesday, July 23 a total of 189,804 Tennesseans had Early-Voted? This is 14.5% ahead of 2010, according to Secretary of State Tre Hargett. Of those votes cast to date, 125,978 were in the Republican Primary while 53,935 were in the Democratic Primary.

Congressman Marsha Blackburn gas been hard at work for the Nashville Music Industry. NSAI's Bart Harbison said that if the music industry lost Marsha Blackburn from Congress, he'd "hang a black wreath on our office & close it for a week." Marsha stands up for this constituency, fighting hard for the creative work of musicians, often waging a fight for more favorable government protection.

Head of the Tennessee Tourism Dept., Susan Whitaker, has signed a 5-year, \$60 million contract with Kansas Citybased Marketing Company VML to promote 2 30-second spots promoting getting outdoors in Tennessee. VML has a branch office in Nashville. With the success of the TV Series, NASHVILLE, many visitors are flocking to see the city.

The campaign to collect petition signatures supporting wine-in-grocery store sales has collected 119,000 signatures state-wide, according to Red, White, & Blue (the non-profit collecting signatures.) Tennessee petitions must have as many signatures as would equal 10% of those who voted in the last

Gubernatorial election in order to get the wine referendum on the local ballot. The petition deadlines is August 21. The petition can only be on the ballot within Tennessee Counties that have passed measure allowing liquor-by-the-drink or package liquor sales.

The U.S. Geological Survey released a new Earthquake Hazard Map, which included Tennessee in the top 16 states most likely to experience an earthquake rumbling. Other states likely to experience earthquake activity are California, Hawaii, Arkansas, Kentucky, & Missouri. The majority of earthquake-vulnerable states are on the west coast.

Pieces of concrete falling from the I-40 Charlotte Ave. Bridge in Nashville caused closing for immediate repairs. There are currently 80 bridges in the Nashville area needing significant repairs. Drivers cross over these bridges an average of 1.5 million times a day. Transportation officials, law-makers, & industry groups have stressed the need to shore up the Federal Highway Trust Fund, which is one of Tennessee's main sources of funding for road construction. The trust, funded by gasoline taxes. Could run out of money by late August.

Comedian Bill Maher has announced the "Flip A District" campaign where a member of Congress will be placed under heavy scrutiny by the Maher Show in hopes of making him/her lose in the 2014 November Election. Rep. Scott DeJarlais is currently among the finalists in this dubious contest by Bill Maher.

Tennessee is launching a state-wide initiative to remind parents & caregivers to check their cars so that children are not left in a sweltering hot car. According to the Tenn. Department of Health, a car's internal temperature can rise quickly to a dangerous level so never leave a child or a pet alone in a car. It takes 10 minutes for a car to reach deadly high temperatures on an 80-degree day. Between 2005 – 2013, Tennessee had 9 deaths due to a child being left in a hot car.
