

### DID YOU NOW?

Republican Party Chairman Chris Devaney announced that the Republican National Committee has narrowed their search for the 2016 Republican National Convention to either Dallas or Cleveland.



Lt. Gov. Ron Ramsey is urging voters to vote NO on the retention of 3 Supreme Court Judges – Cornelia Clark, Gary Wade, & Sharon Lee. All were appointed by Democratic Gov. Phil Bredeson. If these Justices are defeated, Gov. Haslam will appoint 3 new Supreme Court Justices. Currently. All the Supreme Court Justices are Democrats. The Nashville Bar Association sent out a resolution this week urging voters to retain these 3 Judges.

USA Today writes that Middle Tennessee Vets had to wait more than twice as long as the National average for medical treatment. The average Tenn. Wait time was 65 days & only 29.6% saw a Dr. within the 14 day target wait. Nationwide, the average wait for an appointment was 27 days.

Wine-in-Grocery Stores (WIGS) advocates have begun their petition drives to get wine (WIGS) Referendum measures on the Nov, 4 Election Ballot. The ballots will be circulated in 50 Food Center locations plus retail competitors such as Krogers, Wal Mart, Publix, & Food Lion Grocery Stores.

Rawlings is running for the newly-vacated House Seat in District 51, which includes Old Hickory & parts of east Nashville. While Nashville's Music City Center has fallen short of projections for convention bookings, Opryland Hotel is gaining business. HUS projected Music City Center would generate 445, 558 room nights in the first year, but through March had only achieved 115,448. Meanwhile, Opryland Hotel has 2 million room nights on the books while the Music City Center shows 1.1 million room nights.
