
Dr. Mark Green Opts To Skip Senate Run

Dr. Mark Green issued a statement on July 11 regarding his political future.

"Over the past several months, I've been honored and humbled by everyone asking me to run for the U.S. Senate. As Camie and I have prayed about how to best use our time and resources, I do not plan to seek election to the U.S. Senate in 2020. "Over the next two years, the most important fight for the future of our country is helping our President win re-election. The second most important fight will be winning back Republican control of the U.S. House of Representatives. I will be doing everything I can to help win these fights, and look forward to serving in a new Republican majority in 2021 with President Trump in his second term. "I am looking forward to continuing to represent the people of Tennessee by defending the Constitution and supporting the President, stopping abortion and protecting religious freedom, helping President Trump build the wall and end illegal immigration, standing with our troops and supporting our veterans, and stopping the threat of socialism from destroying America."

Green was first elected to the House in 2018. He was the first Clarksvillian elected to Congress in 135 years.

Earlier, Green served six years in the Tennessee State Senate after defeating an incumbent in 2012. He is also an Army veteran who served as an infantry officer before attending medical school and serving as a physician with the famed "Night Stalkers" of the 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment.



The Senate seat held by Lamar Alexander since 2003 is being vacated due to Alexander's retirement after serving three terms. Alexander succeeded the late Sen. Fred Thompson, and the seat has been in Republican hands since 1994.

A number of candidates are expected to contend to succeed Alexander. Former Gov. Bill Haslam earlier backed out of the race.

The GOP is favored to retain the seat in next year's election. A number of Republican vendors are vying for the seat to serve alongside Sen. Marsha Blackburn.
