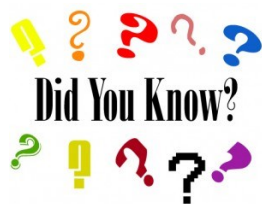

Republican State House Speaker Beth Harwell is admitting that she would “certainly be interested” in running for statewide office.

Since Gov. Haslam is limited to 2 terms in office, speculation is pointing toward Speaker Harwell wanting to become Governor Harwell.

The Midterm Momentum is shifting toward the GOP. A Washington Post – ABC News Poll shows that overwhelming majorities say the country is off-track & give the economy negative ratings. 6 in 10 voters say they can’t trust the government in Washington to do what is right. From ISIS to Ebola to IRS Scandal & Benghazi Cover ups, the majority says that the government’s ability to deal with big problems has declined in the last 6 years. By more than 3-to-1, voters blame Obama & the Democrats instead of Republicans in Congress.

Gov. Haslam & Tennessee Health Commissioner Dr. John Dreyzehner are not currently raising the Health Guidelines for Ebola in Tenn. Currently, they are comfortable with the CDC’s recommendations. Haslam says that since there are no current cases of Ebola in Tennessee, we will not raise our warnings. However, Haslam says that if that situation changes, then certainly the Guidelines would be changed & updated.

This week, Republicans took the lead in Iowa Early Voting & in Absentee Ballots. This is the first time in Iowa History that Republicans have led in both these categories, which should bode well for Republican Senatorial Candidate Joni Ernst. Republicans were also leading in Early Voting & Absentee Ballots in Colorado as of October 24. Republicans had 145, 824 returned ballots compared to the Democrat’s 105, 401. Additionally, the GOP is making sweeping gains among women voters in Arkansas & Colorado – pulling even or ahead of Democrats among women voters, which threatens to close the gender gap which the Democrats have counted on their side for decades.

Tennessee was ranked 6th worst state for political engagement by Wallethub, a personal finance site. Tennessee ranked only above Texas in the lowest voter turnout in the 2010 midterm elections. Tennessee ranked 46th in the % of citizens who voted in the 2012 Presidential election. Tennessee also ranked in the bottom third of states for the % of citizens registered to vote in the 2012 Presidential Election. We should be ashamed of ourselves! Please do your part – go vote on Tuesday, November 4.

The Tennessee Magazine has announced the winners of their annual Best of Tennessee Reader’s Choice Awards. In East Tennessee, Roan Mountain won best state park & Hiwassee/Ocoee State Park was named best rafting outdoor adventure. In West Tennessee, Chickasaw State Park was best state park with Reelfoot Lake State Park selected best outdoor adventure. The best Middle Tennessee State Park & outdoor adventure was Fall Creek State Park.

Sen. Lamar Alexander has commented on the candidate who is campaigning with a chicken dressed in plaid, as not running a “serious campaign.” The chicken is a gimmick for Democratic Senatorial Candidate Gordon Ball, who is trying to force Alexander into a debate prior to the November 4 Election. Alexander says that while running around with a chicken is not running a serious campaign, nevertheless “the chicken does look pretty good in plaid.”
